Kukaniloko Birthstones is a registered Historic Site, State Monument, and Hawai'i State Park (State Site No. 50-80-04-218). It is the birthplace of the highest ranking chiefs of Hawai'i, as early as AD 1060. The Division of State Parks was given jurisdiction in 1992, however, site maintenance, management, and interpretation are provided by the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā, recognized Curators of Kukaniloko Birthstones. *Wahi kapu O Kukaniloko* is one of the most sacred sites in all of the Hawaiian Islands.

Trust for Public Lands asked to be placed on the May 2009 HCC of Wahiawa's agenda to introduce and update land associated contracts regarding the Galbraith 2200 acres [surrounding Kukaniloko] and its eventual parceling. There's also a consideration, through application, which "X" amount of acres surrounding the State Monument Kukaniloko would become the auspice of the OHA?

We are hopeful that our inheritance shall be rightfully issued to 'Aha Kukaniloko... 'ike 'aina... direct and lineal descendants, 'Ohana, the traditions and those lineal descendants tied by tenant rights to these traditional cultural properties that the 'Aha Kukaniloko represents... Please consider this vital discussion reflecting our HCC of Wahiawa's prior and continued practice of care for the associated kulanakauhale...ka'anani'au... resource and land management kuleana...
