Kane, Hulihonua and wahine, Keakahulilani are believed by Hawaiians to have been their earliest ancestors. For 28 generations from *Hulihonua* to *Wakea*, no man was made chief over another. The parents were masters over their own family groups. *Kapawa* was the first chief to be acknowledged as a ruling chief 25 generations after *Wakea*. This was at *Waiialua*, *Oahu*; from then on the Hawaiian Islands became chief-ruled kingdoms. *Kapawa* was the first sacred child born at *Kūkaniloko*.

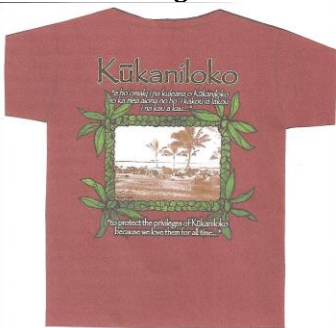
Membership
