**Wahiawa Hawaiian Club Sees Data on 12th Century Heiau...** A project of immense proportions has been undertaken by the Wahiawā Hawaiian Civic Club – the clearing and maintenance of the heiau at Kūkaniloko...Saturday, Aug. 25, for the first scheduled clean up. At the present time the area is completely overgrown with tall weeds and Hilo grass, hiding from view rock formations and location of the sacred birthstone...

That article was written over 52 years ago. The Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā (HCCW) was then newly formed by Cardinal Kuhio Thomas (L) and Mary Kapai Keli'ikipi Thomas [R with Lurline Thomas (Lee) sitting] on November 10, 1960. They, and thirty others, were members of the Waialua Hawaiian Civic Club (WHCC). Circumstances supported their separation from WHCC in order to better serve their own community of Wahiawā...eō




Focus, integrity and commitment set the foundations of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā of today. In 53 years the Club has experienced over 325 members who brought with them more than 150 guests who showed interest in our mission – to inspire, educate, and encourage all things Hawaiian, seen and unseen; while together we chose "to guard the *kapu* of Kūkaniloko because we love them for all time..." Protection of our *pae* 'āina, *iwikupuna, kupuna ma*, and *na'ōpio* are foremost on our agenda. Second, third and fourth generation descendants of the original founding and charter members continue to support their forefathers as Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā members today.

In the early 1970's, The Friends of Kūkaniloko, rooted in the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā, were instrumental in working together to have Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument protected by international law. In 1997, the Hawai'i State Parks Division entered into a ten year Curatorship Agreement with The Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā and The Friends of Kūkaniloko. In 2014, HCCW's maintenance and care of Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument and site interpretation of the 36,000 acres of kalana Kūkaniloko continues. Currently in process is the HCCW/OHA Stewardship of Kūkaniloko Proposal.

As we begin the next 50 years of service to Wahiawā and her surrounding communities, The Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā, The Friends of Kūkaniloko and Na Wahine O Kunia now have a global community of members and friends. Continued perpetual access 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā as we have at present, is status quo in the maintenance and care of kalana Kūkaniloko. Our vision: *kulanui o Kūkaniloko, hale io,* reforestation, restoration of *kapaahuawa a me waihau hoolonopahu*. Our milestones and goals: perpetual maintenance and care *mea ola kanaka mauli o kalana Kūkaniloko no ka mea aloha no ho'i kākou ia lākou i nā kau a kau..."* 

Through diligence, individually and collectively, Kūkaniloko is revealed. Her face is known and can be seen. Her story can be told again and again. The intensity of those who care for her is instilled in those who come to listen so they can see; and they come from around the world. Desire to feel her warmth; taste the rains that cleanse her; smell the invigorating crisp winds that caress her; see her majesty; and embrace her noble history of which we each are proud descendants; families of the land "to guard the kapu of Kūkaniloko because we love them for all time…" This is *Aloha*, the greatest truth of all…*by Kalimapau 2k14*


