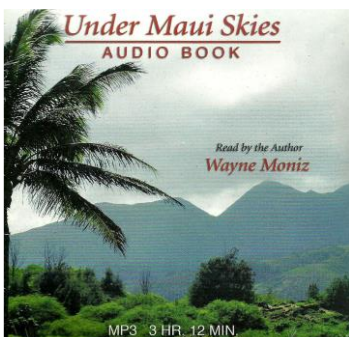

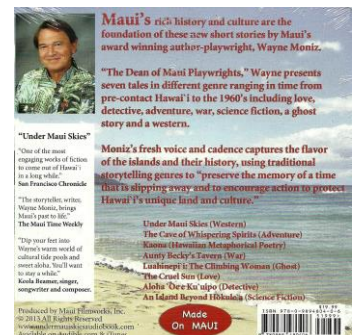

Ki'eke pa'akai pu'upu'u [Satchel of course sea salt]... In September 2000, members of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā hosted the installation of three Interpretive Signs at Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument. HCCW *nā lālā 'ōiwi* who are pictured here met for several weeks to pound *kapa* at Halemano. The finished product was a very long, narrow piece of white *kapa*. This *kapa* was cut into small squares and filled with *pa'akai pu'upu'u*- course sea salt - *ki'eke pa'akai pu'upu'u* were the size of tennis balls! We continue the tradition of sharing *pa'akai* with those visitors who come to Kūkaniloko for site interpretation. We reverently share the **pule...mai kākou e pu pa'akai...come and share salt with us...eō**

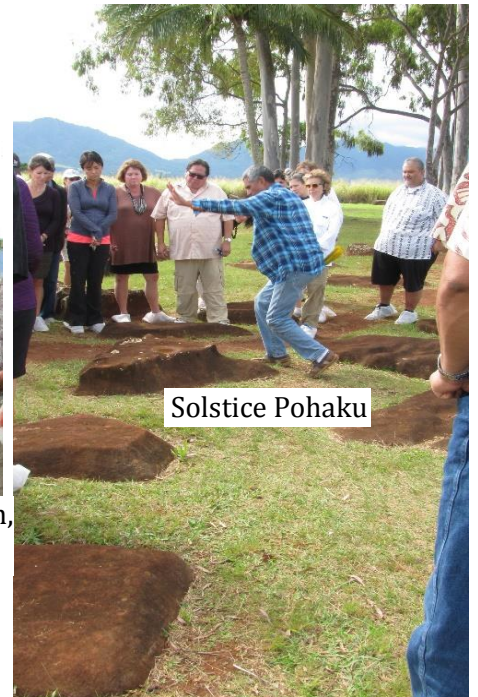

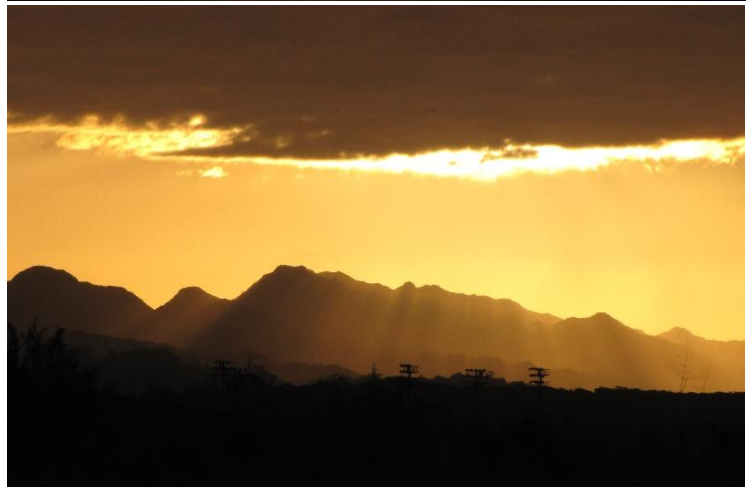

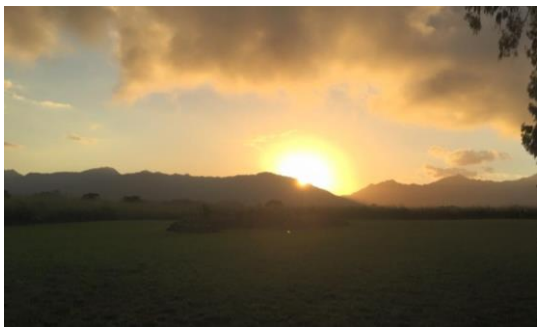

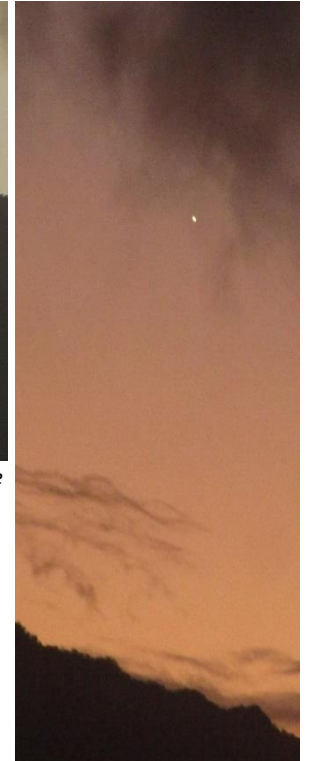
