**5.13.2k15...The Office of Hawaiian Affairs (OHA) Land Division** has presented the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā (HCCW) with a Right of Entry (ROE) agreement. Effective dates are from July 1st, 2015 through December 31, 2018. This agreement defines and acknowledges guidelines for both parties in the continued maintenance and care of Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument; kalana Kūkaniloko. Pelekikena Marie "Malia" Doo signed the Right of Entry on May 13, 2015, signifying that the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā is in agreement. *Nā ho'omalu 'ana...*
