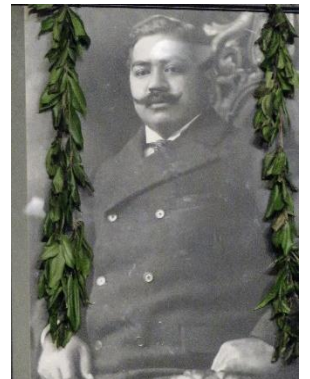

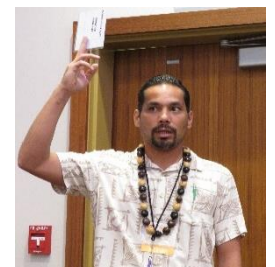

New member, lālā 'ōiwi 'Uilani Akee, brought her son Randall Akee, Assistant Professor of Public Policy and American Indian Studies at

UCLA. He and two other colleagues were guest speakers at the University of Hawai'i on a panel of Indigenous Scholars who discussed critical issues regarding a pathway to U.S. Federal recognition. A visit to Kūkaniloko was a step back in time. Ancient wisdoms and knowledge shared reminded everyone of a time when we were metaphysically connected and centered to the *piko* and everything surrounding us. A Spiritual embrace of *nā hoku*, *'āina*, *kamakani*, *moana*, *kanaka maui* and all creations of *I'o* as our source...*aloha!*

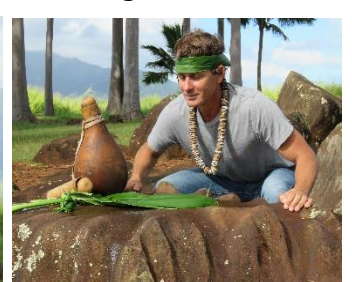
*Mahalo Akee ‘Āina for your visit to Kūkaniloko as the sun finally showed through the clouds as we said aloha no...eō*



**11.19.2k15...November 3<sup>rd</sup> Thursday “Ke Ea O ka ‘Āina” – Land and Citizenship in Hawai‘i Nei.** Despite the heavy rains and poor weather, invited guest speakers Dr. Willy Kauai and Ph.D. candidate, Donovan Preza came and spoke to eight HCCW members and five community members. Produced by the Waianae Legal Fund in association with the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawa and ‘Ike ‘Āina Nonprofit Organizations, several questions followed an informative presentation on the history of Citizenship in Hawai‘i as well as understanding land ownership and recorded documentation. *Mahalo nui...*

*‘Ōlelo No‘eau...MARY KAWENA PUKUI... #2829 Ua mau ke ea o ka ‘āina i ka pono. The life of the land is preserved in righteousness.*

**11.29.2k15...Huaka‘i O‘ahu,** a 140 mile walk by Tom Penna, circled the island of O‘ahu clockwise from Kapukapuakea 11.21.15 and returned to Kapukapuakea 11.28.15. Upon completion, *makana* from each *moku* was brought in reverence to the piko, Kūkaniloko. All hope and prayers manifest through action, healing from the ‘āina!
