During a visit to Kūkaniloko by 85 *haumana* of Mā'ili Elementary School in 2012, navigational training through the studying of the stars in the heavens that rise and set over Kūkaniloko was shared. Students were in awe that the navigational school was located in central O'ahu instead of near the beaches. It was further explained that navigation is the knowledge and understanding of the stars whether on land or on the oceans. They got it! The Waialua Hawaiian Civic Club was established on February 9, 1934. The 32 Founding Members of the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā (HCCW) were long time members of the Waialua Hawaiian Civic Club (WHCC). Circumstances in 1960 supported the separation of these members from WHCC in order to better serve their own rapidly growing community of Wahiawā. Poignantly, HCCW and WHCC became Charter Clubs of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs on the same day of April 16, 1966 – *Sisters in Spirit! Mahalo* to our Founding Kupuna of both HCCW and WHCC who paved the way of our Aloha for our 'āina [family and land] and our traditional comprehension.

Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawa Name Correction... *Kakau 'Ōlelo* Tabangcura drafted a letter to the Oʻahu Council (OC) of the Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs (AHCC) to officially request that their spelling of "Wahi'awa" as our organization name be corrected by removing the 'okina and to recognize our civic club as the "Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawa". We were Chartered with AHCC on April 16, 1966 as the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawa. We request to be addressed as is recorded per our Charter. At that time diacritical marks were nonexistent. There are many variations of spelling and meanings of Wahiawa. We elected to simply be recognized as Wahiawa. *Mahalo* for hearing our request.

Wahiawā...Mary Kawena Pukui indicates in <u>Place Names of Hawai'i</u> that the correct modern spelling is Wahiawā, meaning a "place of noise." *Mo'olelo* **and** *mele* **indicate that the natural topography of Wahiawā created a kind of an amphitheater, so much so that the ocean waves of Hale'iwa could be heard from Wahiawā. Our** *kupuna ma* **of Kūkaniloko had knowledge of this area being a natural amphitheater, not only of sound but of energy thus the enhancement of the births of the highest ali'i that occurred here at** *kapaahuawa***.** *Mahalo* **La'akapu Lenchanko...eō**

Kanaka Maoli scholar Lilikalā Kame'eleihiwa goes into depth about the illegal overthrow and occupation in her work *Native Land and Foreign Desires*, summarized in the passage:

Although Senator Blount's investigative report to the U.S. Congress vindicated Queen Lili'uokalani and recommended her restoration to the Hawaiian thrown, today we Hawaiians still await American justice and have become like foreigners in the 'Āina of our ancestors. Once Hawai'i became an American territory in 1900, foreigners prohibited Hawaiian language and beat Hawaiian children for speaking it. As a result, we became ashamed to be Hawaiian. Now foreigners behave as though Hawaiians don't belong in Hawai'i, calling the Native people "immigrants." There is a great lack of *pono* in Hawai'i today as a direct result of our loss of 'Āina and sovereignty.
