Following Protocol with *Kahu Lonoae`a, Kumu Noelani* shared the *moʻolelo* – traditional comprehension - of the solstice *pōhaku* and the navigational *pōhaku*. *Haumāna* experienced the *Science of Semiotics* - communication through signs and symbols - which revealed the guardian *Pueo* along the edge of the navigational *pōhaku*. Using their bodies and voices, they easily mimicked the *Pueo* as she hunts her prey at night. $E\bar{O}$



05.08.2k19 ... "Pidgin Eye" by Joe Balaz... We say Aloha to Joe Balaz. Joe was born and raised in Wahiawā and graduated with the Leilehua High School Class of 1970. Joe is of Hawaiian, Slovakian and Irish descent and now resides in Ohio. His first book, "Drought" was published in 1985. He is a poet, visual artist and editor of <u>"Ho'omānoa: An Anthology of Contemporary Hawaiian Literature</u>," Joe is well known for his writing in both Standard English and "Pidgin English". We grew up and are most familiar with "Pidgin English" that developed as a form of communication between the immigrant plantation workers in the 1800's. This huge mixed population came to Hawai'i to work together in the pineapple and cane fields while attempting to keep their languages and traditions from the old countries alive. "Pidgin English" is a mix of Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Portuguese, Hawaiian and English languages spoken by these immigrant plantation workers. It is unique to Hawai'i and cherished by all local island people.

In "<u>Pidgin Eye</u>," Joe collects 35 years of his poetry written in Pidgin. His themes feature Hawai'i's history including times of protests as well as the people's love of our land. They are humorous and well written. Best Wishes Joe. $E\bar{O}$
