Haumāna prepared very special presentations honoring the birthplace of their namesake, Mā'ilikūkahī who was the 8th Ali'i nui to be born at Kūkaniloko Birthstones in the early 1400's. Mā'ilikūkahī was a great leader, responsible for creating large land demarcations known as *kaananiau* and other land management methods that defined his time of prosperous and peaceful leadership. *Mahalo haumāna* for your Aloha.
