**Pule kakou e ho`ola** Charter Member, Kupuna Thomas Lopez who is ill and in Wahiawā General Hospital...

**Mana`o...** `o`a – the weaving of the bloodlines of *La`ila`i*, the goddess who stepped down from the heavens at *Waikakalaua*, and *Ki`i*, the image; *hu* – the people as the result of the weaving of these bloodlines; the populace...*o`ahu...ka`anani`au* – a beautiful period of time

**2010 Wahiawā Pineapple Festival** is this coming Saturday, May 8<sup>th</sup>... HCCW *Mele Alaka`i*, Peter *Lonoae`a* will *pule* for the Opening Ceremonial Blessings following the 9am parade from *Ka`ala* school to Wahiawā District Park...HCCW will have a 20' x 30' area near the entrance...the Festival is from 10 – 4pm...the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā personifies the *kanaka mauili* of *Līhu`e*. The theme, "villages" are of the ethnic groups that have since arrived and made Wahiawā their home. Our *kulanakauhale* will be the first area as you enter the grounds of the Festival. Educational material and interpretation of Kūkaniloko presented all day; *mele; hula; mo`olelo; launa aloha; ike hana lima: ulana, kalaina, ku`i a lei, ku`i `ai* and hopefully *ku`i kapa*... all things Hawaiian - seen and unseen - is what we collectively represent. We share, simply, who we are as *kanaka mauili o ka`āina*...if there is anyone who would like to share their crafts, talk story, entertain or just *ho`onanea, e komo mai*...**call 625-7551 so you can be included in planning best use of the space allowed**...we need a few more 10' x 10' tents or one 20' x 30' tent...set up at the park is on Friday evening.

The newly founded **Wahiawā Historical Society** is sponsoring the 2010 Wahiawā Pineapple Festival. There will be a survey of Leilehua High School Alumni going on from 10 - 3pm at the gym. `Ōlelo LHS students will be filming or taking written information on survey forms to answer the question: *"How did your educational experience at Leilehua High School contribute and affect your life's story"*...if you have time stop by the gym. There will be a film festival from 1-4 pm following the VIP Interviews in the gym ... **"KŪKANILOKO - Birth of a Nation"** is the first film at 1pm.

How do we posture and identify the true Hawaiian Nationals?

Hawaiian National:

- Born to the land, regardless of ethnicity
- Have birth rights supported by International law and Hawaiian National common-law
- A living soul and real natural person

Native Hawaiian:

- Definition created by the United States in the 1930 Organic Act to create a Territory of Hawaii
- Labels Hawaiians as aboriginals without birth rights or of a nation
- Second class United States Federal citizen created under the 14<sup>th</sup> Amendment for black Emancipated Slaves
