Kahealani explained, "Development of the 'The Vegetation Continuum' website (VC), is to educate and guide the work that will be done at onsite. This educational web-based tool provides information on dryland Hawaiian ecosystems, Hawaiian-based integrated land management and current restoration efforts in Wahiawā along with volunteer opportunities and works related across the *pae 'āina*. To me, *'āina's* greatest resource is *kānaka;* and *kānaka's* greatest resource is *'āina*. The (VC) is an opportunity for communities, schools, agencies and those interested in learning about *'āina*-based work. To contribute themselves and their energy to the greater health and wellness of *'āina* and *kānaka* through conservation, resource regeneration, and restoring Hawai'i's food system is the goal. This idea originated from the Kūkaniloko Master Plan. I believe

there are greater implications from this work and real potential to build cohesive and resilient communities, starting from the *piko*, Kūkaniloko." 

Poet and visual artist, Joe Balaz was born and raised on Oʻahu in Wahiawā Town. He is a Leilehua High School Class of 1970 alumni now living in Cleveland, Ohio. Joe is of Hawaiian, Slovakian and Irish descent. He is the editor of *"Hoʻomānoa*: An Anthology of Contemporary Hawaiian Literature," Joe is well-known for his poetic writings in both Standard English and Pidgin English. Unique to Hawaiʻi, Pidgin English developed from the mix of Chinese, Japanese, Filipino, Portuguese, Hawaiian and English languages spoken by Hawaii's sugar plantation workers. In "<u>Pidgin Eye</u>," Joe Balaz collects 35 years of his poetry written in Pidgin. His poems are funny and lyrical while they feature themes of history, protest and his love of our '*Āina. Eia mai la. Hoʻomaika'i… Wahiawā in da house!*
