10.09.2k20 ... Wahiawā Civic Center Open House Walk-thru ... "Re-envisioning Wahiawā Civic Center". The State of Hawai'i Department of Accounting and General Services, DAGS, is beginning their planning and design process for the newly funded redevelopment of the Wahiawā Civic Center. Today's displays at the existing Wahiawā Civic Center, next to The Bus Terminal, allowed Wahiawā and her surrounding communities to come to preview their plans. University Of Hawai'i School Of Architecture's Director Cathi Ho Schar, University of Hawai'i Community Design Center, and her *haumāna* were on hand to answer questions about their design intentions. *Pelekikena* Noelani DeVincent and *Pu'ukū* Kalimapau stopped by for a preview. In so doing, they were introduced to the design team. It was a great opportunity to inform them about a little Wahiawā history. It is very important to identify and respect the history of any *āina* that is being developed, even if there was previous development there. Wahiawā families have been caring for Kūkaniloko Birthstones since 1925. *The past is always present...*

The Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā extended an invitation the new design team, Director Ho Schar and the UH Community Design Center *haumāna* to come out for a Kūkaniloko *Piko Listening Journey*. *Eō*

One hour one-on-one Zoom interviews with 23 different community members, including elected officials, neighboring land owners, representatives from WCBA, CBDO, Blue Zones, Wahiawā Historical Society, Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā, New Hope, Wahiawā Health, Dot's **LEI LONOHA** HS, helped the UHDC team to connect to community perspectives.

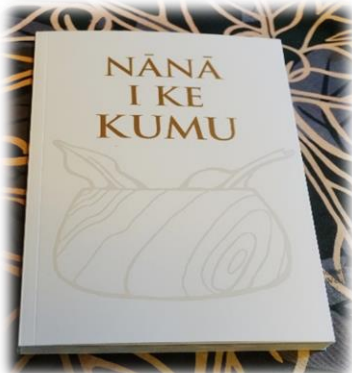

Know in the day of knowing; mana in the day of mana

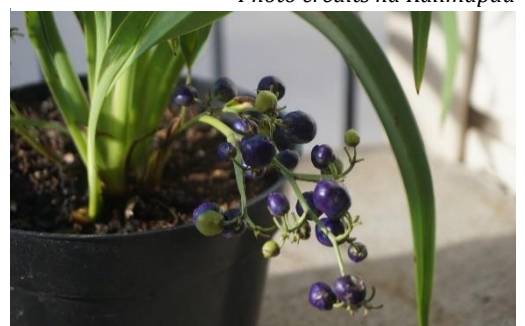
Knowledge and *mana* – each has its day.

10.10.2k20 ... 'Uki'uki ... He Wahine kuku kapa 'o A'ia'i Bello holds a piece of kapa to which she had applied the 'Uki'uki berry dye. Kumu A'ia'i made this sample to be shared with those who come for a *Piko Listening Journey*. Long ago, the central plains of Wahiawā uplands flourished with 'Uki'uki berries. A "superman" among plants, it grows under many varied conditions. In full sun or full shade, with little water or lots of water, indoors, outdoors, in the ground or in a pot, it will flourish year round. 'Uki'uki berries are a very deep purple and produce a dark bluish-purple dye. In the days of *ka Po'e Kahiko*, a very large purple kapa was designed to cover *Pōhaku Kūkaniloko* in preparation for the birth of an *ali'i*. Chiefess birth-mothers were *kapu* and did not touch anyone or anything during *liloe kapu*. Thus, we learn the term "*Born in the Purple*" that represents the highest ranking status for birth of an *ali'i*. "A child born in the presence of the chiefs was called *ali'i* - a chief; *akua* - a god; *wela* - a blaze of heat." [Kamakau 19:38].

"The Hawaiian Chant of Creation" known as the *Kumulipo*, is an ancient chant comprised of more than 2000 lines. It is a genealogical chant, containing 2000 names representing 812 generations. The sum of linear time in that history is about 22,300 years, or roughly one precession of the equinoxes dating back to about 21,000 B.C." 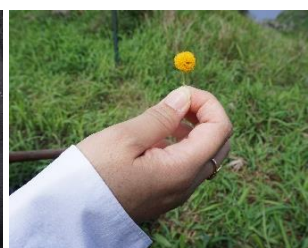
