

In December 2k19, the first group of practitioners were taken to *Mokaena Heiau* to present *ho'okupu*. It has been quiet since. The Department of Defense, DOD, has directed indefinite postponement of proposed Homeland Defense Radar Alternative sites are being investigated. There's a possibility that funds will once again be allotted to this project by the Senate and House Armed Services Committees. We are interested in the Environmental Impact Statement, EIS.



HCCW Nowemapa - November 2020

From the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā Historian Collection...

Wahiawā families worked alongside the Daughters of Hawaiʻi from 1925 – 1950 in the care and maintenance of Kūkaniloko Birthstones. Following the war in the islands, travel became difficult for the Daughters of Hawaiʻi to come out to Wahiawā. In 1950, care was officially turned over to Waialua - Wahiawā Hawaiian Civic Club, who at the time functioned, according to $k\bar{u}puna$, as $n\bar{a}mahoe$ - twins. Following reorganization as the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā in 1960, we, the officially recognized guardians, petitioned for and attained the status of Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument.

Waialua Hawaiian Civic Club established February 19, 1934 (86 years ago) Wahiawa Hawaiian Civic Club established June 15, 1935 (85 years ago) *Waialua-Wahiawā Hawaiian Civic Club 25 years nāmahoe-twins until 1960 Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā established November 10, 1960 (60 Years)

HCCW Kēkēmapa - December 2020

12.21.2k20 ... A "once in a lifetime..." event of the rising of the "2020 Christmas Star" over the view corridor of *kapuahuawa* Kūkaniloko followed the 2020 *Ke Ala Polohiwa a Kanaloa* (Winter Solstice) sunset. The "Great Conjunction of Jupiter and Saturn" (when two planets appeared to be one giant star) was closer in the night sky than at any other point in time since 1623 – 397 years ago. However, it was not visible then as it occurred too close to the sun. The last time that this phenomenon was visible to us from earth was in 1226 - 784 years ago. As the moon rose, the "*Kūkaniloko Star*" identified by Hōkūle'a crew member, Ka'imi Dey, rose in harmony in the skies of *kapuahuawa*.
