02.02.2k21... John A. Burns School of Medicine, JABSOM ... Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument has been **CLOSED** to the public for the past eleven months. January rains prevented earlier planned visits for the annual JABSOM *Piko Listening Journey* covering semester requirements of understanding traditional healing practices of our ancients. After two rained-out attempts, success this day. *Mahalo nūnui* to Dr. Martina Kamaka. CDC guidelines remained in effect. Today's visit by JABSOM *haumana* included observing precautions with masks and social distancing onsite. JABSOM donated (6) *Ki*; (3) *Wiliwili*; (1) *Lonomea*; and (6) *Ulei* to be planted onsite. They were delivered on the first rained out attempt and planted later that week by *kūka'awe* Tom Lenchanko. *Haumāna* were still able to *mālama 'āina* following their *Piko Listening Journey* by raking the newly cut grass. *Mahalo nui loa* for your dedication to *kapuahuawa* Kūkaniloko since your first visit 8 years ago in 2013. You are much appreciated. *EŌ*





02.02.2k21 ... **Today was the day of the taking of annual photos of the grounds.** Progress of the trees, shrubs and rare plants on the entire 5 acres of Kūkaniloko Birthstones is recorded once, and sometimes twice a year. Today there were 290 photos to document their growth and condition while surviving during the COVID-19 Pandemic. All visitors are asked to bring one or two gallons of water for their *mālama 'āina* following their *Piko Listening Journey*. That number is zero gallons of water for the last 11 months. Plants were cared for by the family. They're doing very well now thanks to Mother Nature and the last few weeks of heavy Wahiawā rain episodes. Here are a few photos:
