**05.02.2k21 ... Metaphysically anchored at the center, the *piko*, a 100' radius forms the 200' diameter of the circular placement of *pōhaku* that now defines the “No Public Access” barrier. It beautifully exemplifies Kūkaniloko Birthstone and her companions. Many years of public trespass within these sacred *pōhaku* will hopefully be diminished as humans learn to abide by these restrictions. Presentation of other religious ceremonies, sleeping, picnicking, camping, sunbathing, meditating while sitting on the *pōhaku*, leaving *ōpala* of discarded food receptacles, smoking paraphernalia, and more, are prohibited within these sacred boundaries. This to include the surrounding five acre buffer designated as State Monument Kūkaniloko Birthstones. Regrettably, there are still those who do not show any respect for our ancients. Those numbers will decrease as community and visitors alike learn to honor these ancient sacred *pōhaku* with the reverence they command in their thousands of years of existence. EŌ, eō mai lā. 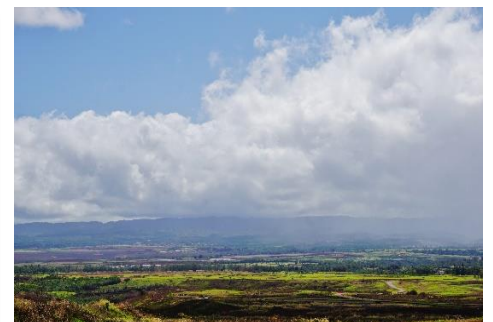
