Native Koa Trees onsite at Kūkaniloko...Early May, on the 9th last month *Wao Kele O Puna's* Irene Sprecher of Forest Solutions and Nick Dudley of Hawaii Agricultural Research Center came for a short visit with OHA's Taylor Asao to inspect the Native trees growing on the ten acres under the care of HCCW. There was a special interest in the large Koa trees on the southwest boundary. These are the oldest Koa.



Nick shares some observations about this koa tree



Two were planted on the first visit of the young doctors of JABSOM in 2013. Eleven more were planted on the fourth visit of the doctors of JABSOM. These Koa are 5-9 years old. They soar at heights surpassing 25 feet. After examination, Nick said "They are happy and doing well, standing tall on their own." Right next to them in the photo on the left, a smaller Koa tree did not survive but it strongly keeps its space until it will be physically removed later.




