

Celebration of Life Kupuna Thomas "TK" Kalani Lopez, Jr. ua hala, October 4th, 2010. Uncle was a Founding and Charter Member for 50 years since November 10th, 1960. He was a Master Sergeant in the United States Army serving in the Korean and Viet Nam Wars and later as an active member of the Hawai'i Army National Guard until his retirement. Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā members Plemer, *Helenihi*, Pappy *Poepoe* and Uncle Tommy were sitting together one day talking story; they decided to go down together to Kūkaniloko. The four of them heard the silent cries of the kupunama to malama 'āina Kūkaniloko; thus, the very first efforts began in the early 1960's. All the HCCW members then brought their 'ohana to begin the kuleana, which we as HCCW members and our 'ohana continue today in 2010: mālama 'āina kapa ahu awa kūkaniloko, Wahiawā and all surrounding communities.
