Kūkaniloko



Traditional Comprehension: Kūkaniloko is 36,000 acres encompassed by Waikakala'ua to the South; Kalena and Lihu'e to the west; Halemano to the North; and Ko'olau to the East. In January of 1992, recognition was diminished to a five acre parcel: Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument...*Auwē, Auwē, Auwē...E auwē ana i ke aloha 'āina...*

02.04.13...The future of Kūkaniloko... Tom Lenchanko held an early morning meeting with Representative Marcus Oshiro and his Chief of Staff Bill Gillispie at the Wahiawā Botanical Gardens. Also in attendance was *lālā 'ōiwi* Pila Short. In the afternoon, a meeting was held at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. Both meetings were scheduled to discuss Kūkaniloko. The OHA meeting agenda included discussion of the reforestation of the OHA 500 acres with 2000 *'iliahi* (as well as *lonomea, neneleau, wauke, lama, nioi*, and more); and the State 1200 acres with 4800 *'iliahi* on the land formerly referred to as the Galbraith lands surrounding Kūkaniloko Birthstones State Monument. Tom expressed intention to gain access from the US Army to seek *Nā kawowo a ke kumu lā'au 'iliahi kūpuna ma Hale'au'au* (the seedlings of the grandfather *'iliahi* tree of Hale'au'au). Chief Executive Officer, Dr. Kamana'opono Crabbe of OHA, conveyed a sincere appreciation for the families of the land and Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā's desire to educate, through Nā Hale Ao 'Aha Kūkaniloko, the thirteen disciplines of Kūkaniloko on our ancestral school lands. Consideration of reforestation of the land may be incorporated into the OHA protection and development plan for Kūkaniloko. Future audience with OHA Trustees will bring opportunity to convey the Hawaiian Civic Club of Wahiawā initiative for restoration of the native ecosystem of Kūkaniloko, Lihu'e, O'ahu, H.I.

Both parties had no response to: (1) prove transfer of exclusive territorial jurisdiction of Kingdom of Hawaii property to the United States Federal government; or (2) affirm perfected title, clear unbroken chain of ownership: Kingdom of Hawaii to George Galbraith to Bank of Hawaii to State of Hawaii.

02.27.13...waha olelo 'aha Kūkaniloko koa mana Tom Lenchanko arranged an onsite visit with Colonel Daniel Whitney, Commander, U.S. Army Garrison-Hawaii, Schofield Barracks. He was accompanied by Honua Consultants Trisha Kehaulani Watson, JD, PhD and Kumu Hula Hinaleimoana Wong-Kalu. Joining them was Pelekikena Kawika Au of the Waialua Hawaiian Civic Club. A brief introduction of those present and exchange of *makana* took place. This visit was short as his schedule was full. A promise to return for a site interpretation and an opportunity to hear our concerns was expressed by Colonel Whitney.



Nā Wahine o Kunia

Aloha mai kakou,

Mahalo for this opportunity to report important data on the current findings in Lihue-Kunia. A meeting was held today with Chris Monahan and Nā Wahine o Kunia. The meeting went well with information shared of the new findings of ancient sites and continued ongoing issues regarding the burials in Lihue-Kunia. In regards to the enclosure in Ekahanui, Chris discovered long bones within the enclosure. Another confirmation of the sacredness in this complex, a traditional ancient village of lo ali'i. In this area of the complex: pohaku in placement, laua'e surrounding the enclosure and a traditional fish pond in the stream-bed.

After our meeting, we had the opportunity to view some of the areas that has been harmed or destroyed by the continuation of development that have gone on without enough watchful eyes. How much more of this kind of neglect by the agencies who should be enforcing laws for ground disturbing activities and the preservation of sensitive Hawaiian cultural ancient sites. We viewed the area of another reservoir being built on the property. Where is the engineer to let these people know the construction taking place has environmentally changed the landscape and leaves those below this area in imminent harm if ground collapses when a period of heavy rain begins?

A cease and desist action should be taken upon this *wahi pana*. Nā Wahine o Kunia requested to be placed on the next OIBC meeting for discussion on the matters at hand.
