

Kūkaniloko Wai'anae Uka...koa mana describes the direct descendants of the Wai'anae Moku

koa = warrior, brave, koa tree *mana* = spiritual power *koa mana* = powerful warrior, spiritual bravery, power of the koa tree This is the male energy - kane



koʻa = coral, sanctuary *mana* = spiritual power *koʻa mana* = powerful sanctuary, powerful coral This is the female energy - *wahine*

The *koa* tree was the sanctuary for birds and the *ko'a* the sanctuary for fish. *Ko'a* or coral was the first living creature born from the universe in the

Kumulipo. The branched ko'a was offered at heiau as a gift of the akua and Kaneko'a was the *ahu* to increase the *o'opu* fish near *lo'i* and streams.
